Course Endorsement:

Each subject may be available for a course endorsement. You can get a subject endorsed with Merit or endorsed with Excellence. To get an endorsed certificate the course must be structured in such a way that at least 3 of the 14 credits must be from internally assessed standards, and 3 from external assessment, with the exception of Level 2 and 3 Physical Education, Level 2 and 3 Religious Studies and Level 2 and 3 Visual Art. To gain a subject endorsement you need at least 14 credits or above at Merit or Excellence.
